### ABOUT OUR CATHOLIC FAITH

**Did you ever wonder....**

#### BREAKING THE HOST - WHY DOES HE DO THAT?

*During the consecration and before the distribution of Communion, I see the priest break off a small piece of the Host and drop it into the chalice with the Precious Blood. Why does he do that? If he fails to do it, does it invalidate the Mass?*

The priest breaks off a small part of the consecrated Host during the *Agnus Dei*, which is after the Lord's Prayer and the sign of peace, but before Holy Communion. The rubrics specify: "Then he takes the Host, breaks it over the paten, and places a small piece in the chalice, saying quietly: "May this mingling of the Body and Blood of Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it." The celebrant breaks the bread because that is what Jesus did at the Last Supper, and on that very night Jesus said, "Do this in memory of me." Furthermore, the priest drops that little piece of consecrated Host into the chalice with the Precious Blood to signify the unity of the Church. As the General Instruction of the Roman Missal explains: "The gesture of breaking bread done by Christ at the Last Supper, which in apostolic times gave the entire Eucharistic Action its name, signifies that the many faithful are made one body (1 Cor 10:17) by receiving Communion from the one Bread of Life, which is Christ, who for the salvation of the world died and rose again" (No. 83). If the priest, for whatever reason, fails to do it, that does not invalidate the Mass.

## PASTORAL COUNCIL MINUTES OF APRIL 12, 2016

The meeting was called to order and opened with a prayer led by Kent Schlegel.

Chris Knatz made a motion to accept the minutes of March 14, 2016, as emailed. Nick Brackman seconded the motion. All were in favor.

**Church Repairs:** PC reviewed the bids for the boiler and AC from 3 companies. A 4<sup>th</sup> company will be submitting a bid and council will make a determination at that time.

PC reviewed a bid submitted by Schnipke Builders to replace the church doors. Council decided to table the bid until after Window Creations gives us an estimate on repairing the stained glass window above the door.

Since the parish is looking at several large repair jobs in the years ahead, it was decided to have a representative from Window Creations come and talk to the parishioners about the repairs needed on the windows. The time and date will be in the bulletin. At that time, PC will go over all the items that need repaired or updated.

**Church Lights:** Nick Brackman has been checking into updating the lights and the rebates available from Midwest Electric. Nick will continue checking into the different options available. It was suggested the lights be cleaned and polished at the time of updating.

**Pastor's Report:** Father reported 90 people made the Consecration to Mary on Divine Mercy Sunday. Everyone will have another opportunity to take part in the 5 week program this summer at St. Patrick. This fall a 10 week course will be offered on the Consecration of Divine Mercy at Holy Rosary.

**Symbolon:** Linda Lunz reported the Symbolon program was well attended and will continue next year.

**Rectory Repairs:** It was noted the roof on the rectory needs to be replaced this year. A determination will be made to see if parishioners can help with this project due to insurance liability.

**Finance Report:** Our current checkbook balance is \$60,810. The first payment for the Capital Campaign was received in the amount of \$6,403. The Capital Improvement Fund for St. Patrick parish has a balance of \$11,205. It was decided to put the Capital Improvement funds into a separate account to avoid using them for operating the parish.

The meeting ended with a prayer lead by Father Barry.

The next meeting will be **June 13<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm** at the St. Patrick rectory.
