Pastoral Council Minutes of June 13, 2016

The meeting was called to order and opened with a prayer lead by President Kent Schlegel.

Linda Lunz made the motion to accept the April minutes as e-mailed with Dave Dwenger seconding the motion. All were in favor.

OLD BUSINESS: Father discussed the renovation of the stained glass windows. Based on the estimated cost of \$124,700 and the funds that the parish has, it was decided a capital improvement fund for the windows be started. Council felt we should have the funds before the project is started to avoid borrowing money.

Glynn School Property: Father will be contacting the Glynn's concerning the possible purchase of the property.

Church Entrance: Council discussed the renovation of the entrance of the church concerning the painting, new lighting, refinishing of the doors and the stained glass window. Since the stained glass window is in need of repair, it was decided to have Window Creations repair the window since we are working on updating that area and this will be a good sample of the work that will be done to the rest of the windows in church in the future.

Church Boiler: PC reviewed a boiler/AC bid from R. A. Flynn and sons. After discussion, Council approved the purchase of a new boiler from Perry's Heating and Air Conditioning. Kent Schlegel will be contacting propane companies and Ed Poeppleman and Mike Ott will oversee the project.

Rectory Roof: The rectory roof will be replaced this summer. Dave Steinke will oversee the project.

Pizza Party: Will be held Sunday, August 7th. Watch bulletin for details.

Servers: New servers have been trained. Father and Council were pleased with the participation of the CCD students at Mass and what a great job they are doing with the ministries.

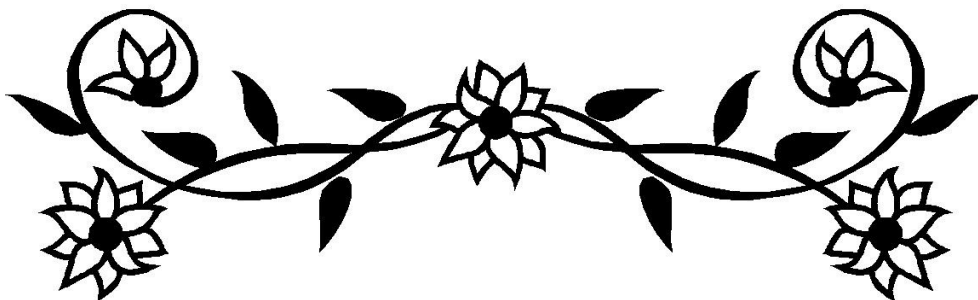
Vacation Bible School: Will take place the last week of July. Please check the bulletin.

Minutes of the Holy Rosary Pastoral Council – May 24, 2016

Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm by Bob Kantner with prayers.

Members present: Bob Kantner, Elaine Paul, Peg Larkin, Robbie Burke, Matt Kinkley, Charlotte Duncan, Jim Schloemer and Al Meinerding. Fr. Barry, Deacon Marty and Seminarian Ambrose Dobrozi were also in attendance. Gene Wilker and Youth Rep. Kelly Wilker were absent.

Minutes from the March 8, 2016, meeting were approved.

Altar Society – Lil Heitkamp reported their last meeting had a speaker who talked about his visit with Mother Teresa. The reception for Alex was well attended. Holy Rosary students helped with spring cleaning of the church.

Knights of Columbus – Joe Kuebler reported the K of C hosted a prayer service in church that focused on the icon of the Holy Family, which was prominently displayed. The Knights circulated the icon through the area. Additional copies were distributed throughout the USA. About 40 people attended. The K of C donated \$500 to Deacon Alex Witt and another \$500 to a seminarian who asked for our help for his overwhelming medical expenses. Our Fr. Byrne Vocations Fund is very well-endowed at this time...as a result, the Knights are blessed to help as many seminarians as they can. New members are always welcome – practicing Catholic men, 18 years old and older. Please visit the Council website, KofC1592.org.

Youth Ministry (CONNECT) – Nan Mielke reported that the high school graduate breakfast is this Sunday, May 29. The group sold a record 89 pro-life t-shirts. Holy Rosary students all wore their shirts on the same day.

Maintenance – Deacon Marty shared that Eric Mielke will be hired as summer help. Most of Marty's time has been spent erecting the storage building at the cemetery. Freytag Construction is to complete the bell tower project. The company is going through some restructuring so we are currently waiting on that to be resolved.

Finance Committee – Fr. Barry said the teachers received raises in order to better conform to archdiocesan pay levels. The next meeting is May 26.

Education/School – Nan Mielke reported CCD is on summer break, but there is a need for catechists for next year. In June, there will be *33 Days to Morning Glory* to be held at St. Patrick's. The Adult Faith Formation for this fall is being planned. There have been requests for the Girls Club again. December 4, will be Confirmation this year. Vacation Bible School will be July 10-14 in the school.

Principal's Report – Nan Mielke reported for Lora Krugh. The school is involving the parents more by having a Mom to Son ball game, Muffins with Mom, Dog Days with Dad and the Father/Daughter Dance. There is a new math curriculum for grades K-5. Enrollment for K-8 is 129 students for the 2016-17 school year. June 18-19 will be the election for new members to the Education Commission.

Liturgy Board – Deacon Marty reported a good response from Holy Week. There has been mention about involving members of St. Patrick's more at Holy Rosary masses. There will be a Lectors workshop this fall. Fr. Barry shared the stained glass windows that will be installed on the north side of the church. There is a sound issue in the cry room. Low gluten hosts need requested before Mass. The Corpus Christi procession was cancelled due to the construction around our campus. May Crowning was May 4th. The 4:30 Mass needs 8 more Eucharistic Ministers.

Old Business: With the installation of the elevator, the state is trying to force a sprinkler system be installed in the church. Deacon Marty is trying to work other things out in order to not have to do that. For example, the Adoration Chapel will be built with a firewall. We hope to break ground for the chapel the week of May 29th. It may be six more weeks before we break ground for the connector, as we also want to wait until after the festival.

New Business: Deacon Marty spoke about the street project around Holy Rosary. He said the workers encountered a gas problem on Beech St. and it may be three more weeks yet before they wrap up the street work. Bob Kantner mentioned council having an alternate member attend the meetings since Scott Hertenstein's departure. It was voted and passed by council that Lil Heitkamp be the alternate. She already attends the meetings and gives the Altar Society report.

Pastor's Report – Fr. Barry will be on vacation from June 23rd – July 3rd. In August, he has a continuing education and preaching seminar he will be attending.

Next meeting will be held on July 5, 2016, at 7:00 pm.



STAINED GLASS WINDOW RESTORATION AND PRESERVATION PROJECT AT ST. PATRICK'S PARISH CHURCH IN GLYNWOOD, OHIO

Status of the Stained Glass Windows at St. Patrick's

The stained glass windows are an essential part of the décor to St. Patrick's, and are in great need of restoration and preservation.

We have a total of 16 stained glass windows in the church. They are very beautiful and also very old. Many of the windows that open have broken or missing glass pieces. Many of these windows do not close completely either.

The storm windows are not in good shape. An attempt was made a few years ago to fit them with storm glass, but unfortunately it was not a very good job. The Plexiglas is warped and discolored, and doesn't have a good appearance. They are not very energy efficient as well. We lose a lot of heating through the windows.

Proposed Restoration and Preservation Project

Window Creations, a company out of Ottoville, Ohio, put together a plan to restore and preserve our stained glass windows. They are a very reputable company which has done a lot of excellent work on area churches.

They propose a three-pronged plan to address the issue of restoring and preserving our windows, which I and the Parish Council have approved:

Priority #1 – Replace the existing storm glass windows with high quality aluminum frames and 1/4" plate glass. The wood frame will be scraped, primed and painted. The storm glass will have special venting to help preserve the windows.

Priority #2 – Restoration of the stained glass in the 24 ventilators (windows that open and close). The windows will be completely re-leaded and cleaned. All broken and missing glass pieces will be replaced.

Priority #3 – Install 12 new ventilators in the main body of the church. The new window frame will have maximum condensation resistance and superior insulation value. They will open and close easily and will be thermal seal when closed, saving on heating costs. The other 12 ventilators will be permanently sealed as they are windows that have not been in use.

Cost of the Project

The cost for the first priority is approximately \$87,000;

Priority two will cost around \$17,000;

And Priority three will cost about \$20,000;

For a total cost of \$121,000.

We have savings of about \$60,000 that will go as a down payment on this project. That means we will need \$61,000 to complete the work.

We will be using the “Capital Improvements” monthly collection envelope to pay for this. If we all chip in over the coming months, I am sure we will have enough to pay for it. We do not want to take a loan and put our parish in debt.

So, please begin to donate for this most necessary restoration project. We owe it to the many people who built our church and the many more who will come here in the future for spiritual nourishment.

If you would like to make a one-time, more substantial gift in memory of a loved one, you can make out a check to St. Patrick’s and note that it for the “Windows”, along with the name(s) of those you want to remember. A large plaque will be made and hung in church for these memorials. A minimum gift of \$1,000 for this memorial opportunity
