Message from the Pastor

Getting back to my German roots has been something I've wanted to do for some time. The Oktoberfest in Minster just isn't enough to really experience where I come from, especially in regards to my Catholic Faith.

So, next spring (April 24 until May 4 to be exact) I will be leading a Catholic Pilgrimage to Northern Italy, Switzerland, Austria and Southern Germany. We will be flying from Columbus to Milan, Italy, then going over to Padua (the home of St. Anthony) and Venice. After this we take a gorgeous bus ride through the Alps to Zurich, Switzerland. Next, will be stops in Austria at Innsbruck and Salzburg (where they filmed the Sound of Music) and ending up in Munich (and a visit to the Hofbrauhaus for some authentic German beer). Along the way, we will make visits to important Catholic sites, such as Einsiedeln (the home of a miraculous statue of the Blessed Mother), the town of Oberndorf (where the song Silent Night was composed and first performed), and Altotting (one of Germany's most celebrated pilgrimage shrines).

The number of pilgrims is limited on this trip, so first come first serve. The trip involves a lot of walking, many steps and hills, so be prepared. The cost of the trip is \$3,795, which includes airfare, bus, hotel, museum entrance fees, two meals per day and all tips. It's going to be a great time – just ask anyone who was with me in Italy last year and they'll tell you there is no other trip like one with Father Barry. It will be spiritually enriching, full of history and beauty, and a lot of fun.

Both sides of my family come from southern Germany, and I've never been there before; so it's going to be a special trip for me. Just to see the countryside and the churches and the people from my ancestry is going to be a fantastic experience that I hope you can share with me. Minutes of the Holy Rosary Pastoral Council – July 5, 2016

Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm by Bob Kantner with prayers.

Members present: Bob Kantner, Elaine Paul, Peg Larkin, Robbie Burke, Matt Kinkley, Charlotte Duncan, Jim Schloemer and Al Meinerding. Fr. Barry was also present. Deacon Marty, Gene Wilker and Youth Rep. Kelly Wilker were absent.

One small correction was made to the minutes from the May 24, 2016, meeting.

Altar Society – Lil Heitkamp reported the next meeting will be in September. At that meeting, names will be gathered for those couples celebrating their 25th, 50th and 60th anniversaries so a reception can be planned.

Knights of Columbus – Joe Kuebler reported they have a light meeting schedule during the summer – only one meeting during June, July and August – the second Thursday of each month. Several of the Knights will be volunteering a couple of hours at Agape this week. The K of C has been blessed with much success in accumulating money in our Charity account. We will be looking for ways to use this money. The Holy Rosary School and Religious Education will probably see nice donations in the future. Youth Ministry (CONNECT) – No report.

Maintenance – Deacon Marty reported the foundations are complete at the cemetery. The cemetery storage shed turned out very nice. The school has been cleaned and floors have been waxed. Bible school will begin in the classrooms next week. The church basement needs cleaned as a result of a doorway that had to be cut in the 26 inch thick wall to gain access to the new room below the adoration chapel.

Finance Committee – Fr. Barry said there was not a meeting, but a pay schedule throughout the expansion project has been received.

Old Business: Phase 1 of the building project is underway with the construction of the Adoration Chapel. Freytag Construction has yet to complete the bell tower project. They are waiting on a permit to be passed by the state for the connector. The connector is to be complete by Christmas break. The whole project should be done by April, 2017.

New Business: Deacon Marty is meeting with Ferguson to rewire the parking lot for next year's festival since the modulars will be gone by then. Some of the electrical boxes and connections are rusty. When the new section of the church and the connector are added, new church pews and possible new flooring under the pews will be installed at that time.

Pastors Report – Fr. Barry had a nice vacation. In August, he will be attending a continuing education and preaching seminar.

Next meeting will be held on August 23, 2016, at 7:00 pm.
