Message from the Pastor

The construction project at Holy Rosary is really in full swing, with guys up on the roof, laying block, digging and pouring cement everywhere. There must have been 25 workers around the buildings this week, working away. We hope to have everything under roof by the middle of October and be able to move into the new classrooms by Christmas break. I think we are on schedule.

At St. Patrick's, we are a go on restoring the stained glass windows. The total cost will be around \$129,000. I know that sounds like a lot, but it is absolutely necessary that we address the window conditions right now. We have donations and pledges for around \$38,000 already. You can have a dedication plaque for a window if you donate \$6,000, in remembrance of a loved one or to honor of your family. There are 22 windows available for dedication and we have received 6 already. It would be a great way to remember someone like your grandparents who were parishioners and really loved St. Patrick.

The remodeled entrance way is coming along well. We have two new doors ordered and the stained glass window is being redone as we speak. I am happy we are doing this. Sometimes you just get used to the way something looks and it turns out to be kind of old and used looking. A fresh redo of an area like the entrance way to church can do a lot to give new life to our church. Special thanks to Ellen Brown and Dave Steinke for their work on this.

And amid all this physical restoration and building, we can't forget why we are doing this – for the spiritual uplifting and growth of our parishes. I am very happy to say that the Consoling the Heart of Jesus retreat that we started last Sunday had 80 people attending. It was a fantastic start and we are going to reap the benefits of this excellent spiritual program. We only had the introduction session last week. You can still join us and easily catch up. It is a powerful experience of Christ and the Divine Mercy. If you need Jesus and His Mercy in your life – and we all do – then join us in the church basement at Holy Rosary Sunday evenings at 6:30. You'll be glad you did, I guarantee it.

BUS TRIP TO THE SHRINE OF CHRIST'S PASSION

Where lives are changed one soul at a time!
Sunday, October 9th

Located at 10630 Wicker Ave. (US41) in St. John, Indiana, *The Shrine of Christ's Passion* is a multi-media interactive, half mile winding Prayer Trail that depicts the last days of Jesus Christ's life on earth. Forty life-size, bronze sculptures in a tranquil setting complete with beautiful music and amazingly sculptured gardens allow visitors to experience the story of the Crucifixion and Resurrection as never before! Chicago broadcaster, Bill Kurtis, narrates the audio recordings that you hear at listening stations along the path.

Construction on the interactive winding pathway began in 2001 and included 3,000 yards of concrete, approximately 80 semi loads of boulders, and more than 1,000 trees and bushes. Created by Texas artist Mickey Wills, 40 life-size bronze sculptures, weighing 300 to 700 pounds, vividly tell the story of the last days of Christ.

The Shrine is operated by a non-denominational, non-profit, 501(c)(3) private foundation. **There is no cost for this excursion.** The proceeds from the Gift Shoppe and donations help to maintain the grounds.

We will leave St. Marys at 6:15 am from K-Mart's parking lot and return by 7:30 pm. Bring your own sack lunch. We will stop for supper on the way home. Holy Rosary Pastoral Council Minutes – August 23, 2016

Meeting called to order and led in prayer at 7:00 pm by Bob Kantner.

Members Present: Bob Kantner, Jim Schloemer, Robbie Burke, Matt Kinkley, Gene Wilker, Peg Larkin, Charlotte Duncan, Lil Heitkamp, Al Meinerding, Deacon Marty, and Fr. Barry. Elaine Paul & Kelly Wilker were excused. Bob Kantner commented that the Education Commission has been re-instated to the agenda.

The minutes from the July 5, 2016, meeting were approved.

Altar Society: Lil Heitkamp reported there are 11 couples celebrating 25th, 50th, and 60th wedding anniversaries this year and will be honored at Mass & reception on September 25, 2016. Tentative Fall Bake Sale date is November 4, 2016.

Knights of Columbus: Joe Kuebler reported that they recently donated \$500 to Alex Witt for some unexpected expenses. Members fried chicken for the Chicken Bowl last Friday. They will be frying chicken again in Minster for the Girl Scouts at Oktoberfest. They have also been looking at an outdoor Nativity set to donate to the parish, and have found one at The Cornerstone Shop in New Bremen. They had earmarked \$3000 for the purchase, and this set will cost about \$3700. If anyone wants to donate an animal for the set, please contact Joe. They will put it somewhere on the Spring Street side of the church.

On September 24, after 4:30 Mass, they will be hosting an appreciation dinner for those who have worked hard during the past year to make the Council a success. They are also inviting Parish and School staff to show their appreciation for the work they do.

Youth Ministry: They don't meet over the summer but begin on September 7.

Maintenance: Deacon Marty reported that Eric Mielke was a huge help this summer at the cemetery with setting of 11 foundations, removal of three trees, painting and plumbing work in the school. The modulars continue to deteriorate. Some classes have been moved to the rectory basement and Deacon Marty's office has been moved to room 1 in the modular.

Finance Committee: Fr. Barry reported that we have secured a construction loan for \$800,000 at a fixed rate of 3.25% which will be paid off in 3-4 years. This allows us to pay Ferguson as needed. Budget looks good; teacher salaries are in good shape; the parish secretary received a raise.

Education Commission: CCD begins September 7, from 7-8:00 pm. They are set with teachers, but are in need of substitutes. Little Flowers Girls' Club begins on Thursday, September 22, from 6:30-8:15 pm in the cafeteria for grades K-3. Julie Turos and Sara Ahlers will be the leaders. RCIA begins September 22. ConQuest Boys' Club also begins September 22, from 6:30 – 8:15pm.

The Book of James and Consoling the Heart of Jesus will be held this fall. FORMED, a Catholic on-line informational site (Think Catholic Netflix) for movies, books, information, Bible studies, and Sacramental preparation is now available from your computer, tablet, or smartphone at Formed.org. Our parish password is TFWVVK.

The school Mass will be on Tuesdays at 8:15 am and they are still in need of Mass Buddies for the second grade. Envision 2.0 is the new math series being used in grades K-6. Enrollment is 128: 26 K students; all students in grades 4-8 are back! Amber Pohl will teach Pre-K in the mornings and work afternoons with the K class due to the large class size. Beth Buck moved to first grade; Russell Kill and Pat Larkin will be with the upper grades. Everyone is being very, very cautious with the construction...parents, staff and students as well as the construction workers.

Liturgy Board: No report

Old Business: Chapel walls and the roof are up; brick laying should start by August 29, along with block laying on the connector, concrete floors for the classrooms, ramp, restrooms, and the concrete deck for the overflow. Good news is there is no need for a sprinkler system and our new alarm system will be connected directly to the St. Marys Fire Department. The sprinkler system would have added \$50,000 for the new addition or \$260,000 for the entire church. The contract increased by \$175,243.00 for classroom restrooms, a canopy over the steps leaving the new entrance heading back towards the school, a new sanitary sewer line all the way through the parking lot and a closet beside the elevator to conceal the electrical panels. In 30 days we should have a structure similar to the chapel addition for the overflow/classroom additions. The elevator is pretty consistent in running with the occasional issues of power surges that result in the computer needing to be reset.

New Business: We are adding and taking ownership of a sewer pipe that will allow the City to vacate the alley (area just outside of the parish office) resulting in our ownership of the entire block.

Approved a change in our contract with Ferguson that deletes an accordion wall in the new overflow area (saves \$13,348) and adds restrooms, closet next to the elevator, extend a shelter on the east side of the entrance, replacing fascia trim and wiring for the festival electrical panels.

Pastor's Report: Fr. Barry would like us to come to the next meeting with names to be considered for the adoration chapel. Our new intern, Ambrose Dobrozsi, will arrive August 27. He will be with us until May.

Deacon Alex hopes to be with us once a month. His ordination is May 20, 2017, and Fr. Barry plans to get a bus for parishioners to attend.

October 9, 2016, a bus trip to St. John, Indiana, to see the Shrine of Christ's Passion program.

The bible study, The Book of James, will be held on Tuesday evenings starting September 13.

Consoling the Heart of Jesus had about 40 people that attended the first informational meeting. This study is being highly recommended by Fr. Barry.
