Message from the Pastor

Connect! That's the name our Youth Group came up with last year to call themselves. Connect! It has a nice ring to it. It is so easy for high school kids to disconnect from the world around them. The Youth Group wants to help them keep connected – to friends, to family, to the parish, and to God. At our second meeting of the year, I had all the kids over to my patio for a fire, snacks, and fun. It was a real bonding moment for the youth group. At the meeting, we passed around a card for our youth group director, Olivia Spieles, who has just given birth to her first son. So I and our seminarian, Ambrose, took over. Ambrose gave his vocation story, which delighted the kids. I told them that they need the fire of the Holy Spirit in their hearts to make the youth group work as it should.

Fire can be a dangerous and uncontrolled thing. Think of the grass fires out West. But in regards to its symbolism in our spiritual life, it is the dynamic, energizing force of the Holy Spirit within us, which helps us realize our true potential in Christ and seek out his plan for our lives.

This applies to anyone who is really interested in the true meaning of their life. We have to have the Spirit of God in our hearts; a spirit of true love, which will impel us to do the great things God has planned for us. Without that fire from above, the soul is lifeless, static, cold and hard. With God's Spirit, it is full of life, warmth and energy, desiring to do all it can to please God and help others.

As the fire burned that night on my patio and the nachos were munched, the kids made a commitment to the Youth Group, Connect! And they made a commitment to finding God's Will for their lives – how they were to know, love and serve Him in this life, in order to be happy with Him for Eternity.

We have some amazing young people at our parishes. We need to keep encouraging them to keep God in the first place in their lives and to seek to serve others rather than themselves. To do this, we have to first do it ourselves. Let's continue to pray for our children and for the youth group at Holy Rosary.

BUS TRIP TO THE SHRINE OF CHRIST'S PASSION

Where lives are changed one soul at a time!
Sunday, October 9th

Located at 10630 Wicker Ave. (US41) in St. John, Indiana, *The Shrine of Christ's Passion* is a multi-media interactive, half mile winding Prayer Trail that depicts the last days of Jesus Christ's life on earth. Forty life-size, bronze sculptures in a tranquil setting complete with beautiful music and amazingly sculptured gardens allow visitors to experience the story of the Crucifixion and Resurrection as never before! Chicago broadcaster, Bill Kurtis, narrates the audio recordings that you hear at listening stations along the path.

Construction on the interactive winding pathway began in 2001 and included 3,000 yards of concrete, approximately 80 semi loads of boulders, and more than 1,000 trees and bushes. Created by Texas artist Mickey Wills, 40 life-size bronze sculptures, weighing 300 to 700 pounds, vividly tell the story of the last days of Christ.

The Shrine is operated by a non-denominational, non-profit, 501(c)(3) private foundation. **There is no cost for this excursion.** The proceeds from the Gift Shoppe and donations help to maintain the grounds.

We will leave St. Marys at 6:15 am from K-Mart's parking lot and return by 7:30 pm. Bring your own sack lunch . We will stop for supper on the way home. 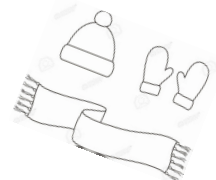

St. Patrick Pastoral Council Minutes of September 12, 2016

The meeting was called to order and opened with a prayer lead by President Kent Schlegel. Chris Knatz made a motion to accept the June minutes as emailed and Vern Yahl seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Old Business

Kent Schlegel went over the information he received from two propane companies, Truepoint and Landmark for the new boiler. CC propane has not returned his call.

Father reported the Glynn property was purchased by the parish. With more parking area available, signs for "no parking" along the cemetery will be put up since it is a traffic hazard.

Altar candlesticks are being polished by Dayton Supply and converted to oil.

A hanging sanctuary light will be mounted on the wall.

Roof on the rectory will be replaced yet this year, weather permitting.

Finance report:

Council reviewed parish finances. Report shows parish is in the black including the purchase of the new boiler and Glynn property.

Council reviewed the contract from Window Creations for the restoration and preservation of our stained glass windows. Total cost of project is \$129,950 and will be started in 2017. Donations from parishioners and friends of the parish are being accepted. Father will be signing the contract to lock in the 2016 prices as quoted.

Pastor's Report:

Father reported the Consoling the Heart of Jesus retreat has started and many St. Patrick parishioners are participating.

CCD will start September 14, and Father will have Mass for CCD on Wednesday, September 21.

Attendance for Adoration has been good, but could be better. Father will be talking to the parish about participating.

It was noted the organ is not working. Polly Muhlenkamp will contact repair man. Bells are not ringing properly. Maintenance Committee will follow up on this.

New Business

Turkey Party tickets will be disturbed on October 2nd. A dinner with Father Barry will be auctioned off at the party as in the past.

Work on the church entrance will continue in the month of October.

The meeting ended with a prayer by Father Barry.

The next scheduled meeting will be October 10, 2016, at 7:00, at the St. Patrick Rectory.
