Message from the Pastor

Back in December I put the question to you, "How do you keep your kids Catholic?". I told you that if you yourselves are sincere in living your faith, your kids will be more likely to practice their faith.

Now I'd like to go into the details of what you should do to ensure the Catholic Faith remains in your family for years to come. Of course, Sunday Mass is at the core of your efforts. Showing enthusiasm for going to church each week by getting there early, singing the hymns and following the readings attentively, talking about the homily on the drive home or at breakfast after, will all impress upon your kids the necessity of attending Mass each and every week. When you are on vacation, make sure that Sunday Mass is a part of your planning can really impact your kids faith.

To keep your kids Catholic, I think sending them to Holy Rosary School is probably the best thing you can do. But if not, make sure they are at CCD and take an interest in what they are learning, is essential.

To keep your kids Catholic, I think going to monthly Holy Hour at Holy Rosary on the Thursday before First Friday or the third Thursday at St. Patrick is a great way to imbue them with love for the Catholic Faith. To show them that you are more than "Sunday Catholics" will make a deep impression on them. Weekly adoration is also a great aid towards keeping the faith alive in your kids. Going to adoration as a family once a week would be something I wouldn't leave out.

These are some specific things that should be a part of your family's life right now to give your kids the kind of Catholic foundation that will keep them in the Church for the rest of their lives. To think that anyone would compromise the eternal salvation of their children because of a volleyball game or soccer practice prevented them from going to Mass or CCD! Or a vacation to a beach would be more important than an eternity in Heaven. Think about it – you made a promise at their baptism that they would be "trained in the practice of the Faith." This was a promise you made before Almighty God. So, how important is it for you? Is there any comparison between eternal life in Heaven and anything we use as an excuse not to work towards this goal by practicing our faith?

So, stop with the wrong priorities in parenting your children! Put the practice of the Catholic Faith in first place in the life of your family. Then you won't one day lament that your kids no longer go to church.

St. Patrick Windows

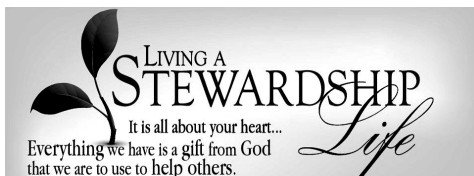
