Message from the Pastor

One hundred years ago, in 1917, our Blessed Mother, Mary, appeared to three young children at Fatima in Portugal. Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco were peasant shepherds and on May 13th saw a beautiful woman appear over a bush while they were with the sheep. She then appeared on the 13th day of each month, until October. It would be in October of 1917 when she would show them a great sign to verify the apparition.

These children were simple kids, full of joy and youthful energy. The vision of Mary would change their lives completely.

Mary asked them to pray the Rosary for the world which was rushing towards destruction at the brink of the 20th century. The world was at war, and in Russia, the Communist Revolution would soon begin.

Mary gave the children three secrets. The first was a vision of hell itself. The second was the world war would end, but that another great world war (World War II) would begin and Russia would spread its error over the whole world (Communism). These things would happen if men would not convert to God. And the third, which would remain secret and only known to the Popes until St. Pope John Paul II would reveal it, was that the Holy Father would be shot and killed. This of course happened on May 13th, 1981, but the Pope's life was spared. As he said during his recovery, "One hand fired the pistol, another hand guided the bullet."

Mary asked for many prayers, especially the Rosary and Communions of Reparation on the First Saturdays of the month for the salvation of souls. Finally, at the final vision on October 13th, God worked the great Miracle of the Sun. It was a rainy Fall day and over 70,000 people gathered to witness. The sun danced in the sky and then came hurtling towards the earth. The people thought it was the end of the world. Even skeptics and atheists witnessed the sign and could not deny it. But just before the sun crashed into the earth, the sun took its normal place, the sky cleared and all was completely dry. It was a miracle which validated everything the Blessed Mother wanted to tell us at Fatima.

The Church has totally approved this apparition and the promotion of the devotion to Our Lady of Fatima. Each May and October we highlight this by placing the Lady of Fatima statue in the sanctuary of church. And we are faithfully reciting the Rosary before every Mass offered in our church.

So, this year read up on the Apparition and Secrets of Our Lady at Fatima. Watch the movie, *The 13th Day*, on FORMED.org. Let's bring our Lady more closely into our lives through the 100th Anniversary of Fatima.

The meeting was called to order and opened with a prayer led by Kent Schlegel.

OLD BUSINESS: The church entrance is almost complete. Window Creations will be etching "St. Patrick" on the transom this spring along with installing the storm window and trim.

The former Glynnwood School has been torn down and Kent will be contact Midwest to move poles if possible.

The new boiler has been installed.

Window Project: The window project will be started this spring and donations are being accepted. If you are interested in donating \$6,000 or \$12,000 for a window plaque, you can reserve naming rights as to which window you would like your plaque posted. Christmas: Masses were well attended, the decorations looked great and the Children's Choir did an outstanding job.

New Business: The 2016 Turkey Party results were reviewed. Profit for 2016 was slightly less than 2015. It was suggested the Turkey Party Committee check out Galaxy Hall for next year's party which will give us more room.

A new project will be undertaken the first part of February. Nick Brackman and Ed Poepplemen will start taking down two of the church lights for cleaning, polishing, rewiring and refitting. There are two signup sheets at the church entrance. One to help Nick and Ed take down and reinstall the lights and one for volunteers to help clean and polish the light fixtures. Once the project is organized, you will be contacted for your help. A Chair is needed for the cleaning and polishing of the fixtures.

Maintenance was also made aware of some of the electrical plugs that need to be looked at in the church. Bells: PC decided to have a bell company come and evaluate the condition of the bells and what is needed to have them fixed.

St. Patrick gave a \$50 donation in memory of Alex Witt's mother who passed away in December.

Kent Schlegel reported that Dave Whitney salted the parking lots at church on December 16th after the ice storm. Linda Lunz will send a thank you note as Dave did this free of charge.

The meeting was closed with a prayer.

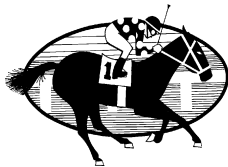
