Message from the Pastor

Sometimes I think no one is listening to me. Maybe I'm not making myself clear; maybe I am repeating myself too much; maybe people are just too absorbed in their lives that they just can't give their attention to me. I don't know. Albeit, sometimes I am preaching to the choir, which is very nice. Really, the choir is sometimes the only ones who laugh at my little jokes. But most of the time I wonder if anyone is listening.

I am your pastor, the shepherd of your souls. Your eternal destiny is my responsibility. That is no small matter. I take it very seriously. Not to aggrandize myself (make myself bigger than I deserve), but of all the people you should be listening to, I am one of the most vital for your life – next to the Holy Father and our Archbishop. And it is not for any personal talent that I have; it's due to my position as your parish priest. This makes it all the more humbling and scary for me – I feel the weight of my responsibility of being Christ for you.

So, this Lent, if you haven't caught on, I stressed two things: going to the Sacrament of Confession and doing Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Also, I have been encouraging everyone to attend the parish retreat throughout Lent on Sunday nights at 6:30. We do have about 60 people in attendance and that is great. But last week only one new couple who wasn't registered for the retreat came to the second session. We still have four sessions left until April 9th.

In last week's Gospel, we heard God the Father call out to the three Apostles on the mountain at the moment of the Transfiguration of His Son: "Listen to Him!" One of the primary ways you listen to Jesus is through your pastor.

Each of you must decide to open your ears and listen to what I'm suggesting for your spiritual lives. Then you must open your wills to put what you hear into practice. Please know that everything I suggest to you, I'm pushing myself to do as well. I never preach anything to you that I am not working on myself.

I humbly hope, for the good of your souls, you will listen to me. Then I hope we have a fuller church each week; I hope we have more students at our school next year; I hope we have a full church for monthly Holy Hours and Benediction; I hope we have three or four people in the adoration chapel at every hour of the day and night; I hope we have long lines for confession; I hope we have 300 people at the parish retreat during Lent and the at the Bible Study next Fall; I hope we have 50 men at the Men's Fellowship on every other Saturday morning throughout the school year. And because of all this, I hope and pray we have very happy, devoted, faithful parishioners. If you listen, we can.

Minutes of the Holy Rosary Pastoral Council – February 28, 2017

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Bob Kantner with prayers.

Members Present: Elaine Paul, Charlotte Duncan, Bob Kantner, Robbie Burke, Pam Rammel, Matt Kinkley and Al Meinerding. Fr. Barry, Deacon Marty, Joe Kuebler, Lil Heitkamp and Jessica Rammel were also present. Jim Schloemer, Peg Larkin and Kelly Wilker were excused.

Minutes from the January meeting were approved.

Altar Society – Lil Heitkamp reported Fellowship Sunday on February 12 was well attended. Lenten lunch is approaching. Alex Witt is being ordained on May 20. He will be saying the 11am Mass here on May 21, with a reception to follow. March 21 is the next meeting. Jane Bertke will be speaking on her trip to Fatima. March 24 is the Spa for the Soul. It is full with 170 ladies. Concert only tickets will be available at the door or at the parish office for \$10.

Knights of Columbus – Joe Kuebler reported there was one district winner of the free throw contest; Elena Menker won the girl's 13 year old division. The Lenten fish fries began this week. \$8.00 eat in, \$7.00 carry out. There will only be 5 this year; no fish fry the evening of the Spa, March 24, and on Good Friday as it conflicts with Eagles. The annual All-Ohio raffle campaign tickets are available. Buy a ticket or two. This campaign directly subsidizes our 40+ charitable events. New members are always welcome – practicing Catholic men, 18 years old and older. We are conducting an admission degree exemplification this coming Thursday in the hall. Please visit the Council website, **KofC1592.org**.

Youth Ministry (CONNECT) – Fr. Barry reported March 22 is IHOP. Other youth groups from the area are invited to attend.

Education Commission – Robbie Burke reported for Lora Krugh & Nan Mielke. Registration is underway. Pre-K has moved into the new classrooms in the church basement. Lenten prayer services are planned for each Friday of Lent. Ohio Catholic School Accreditation Association – our goals will be finished up in our final progress report due in April – the domains of the church and math problem solving. Dress code was discussed with adherence on dress down days. Marketing of Holy Rosary School was discussed; with most in agreement that Facebook is important! The Education Commission is looking for a few good members to run.

First Reconciliation was January 25 for 34 Holy Rosary 2nd graders. ACREs – are completed for the year for 5th, 8th and 12th grades. It is used as one of several means in trying to assess the effectiveness of our Religious Education instruction in the parish. There is no substitute for parents teaching and living the faith in their homes! *Spa for the Soul* is booked full. We have switched to Concert only tickets for \$10. Those people will arrive in the church for a 7pm program only. The group *His Own* is coming from Nashville for the Concert and testimonial portion of the evening. This group is also doing a day retreat the following day in St. Henry. RCIA and RCIC are preparing for the Rite of Election in Dayton on March 5th. The high school CCD is hosting another IHOP (Intense Hour of Prayer) on March 22. Ambrose is coordinating this event. There will be confessions, adoration, benediction and live music during this event for high school teens. Eight students attended the *March for Life* in DC along with 4 adults. Carol Katter was one of the chaperones and has been inspired to start a LIFE group with our teens. It is just in the planning stages – but is thinking of meeting once a month during CCD next year. It would involve junior high and high school students. She is looking into helping at Crisis Pregnancy Centers. Summer camp info is coming out and we are encouraging our youth to take advantage of camps and retreats as they become available. *Nun Run* is under construction. Boys will be encouraged to attend a weekend retreat March 17-19 in Indiana. Conquest is holding their annual Lenten Day retreat on March 4th, from 9-3, in the school and parish grounds. The Lenten Study – *33 Days to Merciful Love* will be held during Sunday evenings of Lent from 6:30-8pm in the cafeteria beginning March 5th. About 50 parishioners from St. Patrick and Holy Rosary have registered. We are starting a Girls Club, March 15, right after school on Wednesdays until 4pm for girls in 4th-8th grades. This is being started as a continuation for girls to advance to after they finish Little Flowers which is for girls in K-3rd grades. Times and dates for next year may change if we see an interest from public school parishioners in 4th and 5th grade. We wanted to get something started this year since girls at Holy Rosary have requested a club.

Maintenance – Deacon Marty reported there is a breakdown in the drain on the north side of the church. School toilet is not cycling so he will be installing a toilet from the modular. There are problems with the women’s sinks in the restroom in the church basement. The boiler pumps in the school need replaced. There will be a meeting to clarify the cleaning requirements of the school vs. the church.

Finance Committee – Jessica Rammel reported 113 students are registered for K-8 next year and 21 students are not registered for a total of 134 students. Also, 23 students are registered for pre-K. There is still room for 5 pre-K students. Through the *Archdiocese One Faith, One Hope, One Love* tuition assistance – 32 families applied for aid. Eight families (15 students) have been awarded \$1000 per student. The Archdiocese is currently accepting a second round of applications. Letters either awarding or denying assistance should be received in March. If families did not receive assistance from the Archdiocese, the families may still receive assistance through Holy Rosary. Families that have already submitted an application just need to upload your 2016 W-2s and Federal tax form to be eligible. Assistance from Holy Rosary will be awarded in May. The expenses for the church are within budget. Collections in February were down \$7000; they are down \$16K for the year. There are 530 registered envelope users and only 190 envelopes were collected each Sunday. This is down 40 envelopes per Sunday from last year.

Liturgy Board – There was not a meeting, but Fr. Barry reported he met with Brian to plan the music for Lent.

Update on Phase #1 & #2 of the building project: Deacon Marty reported Phase 1 – the chapel – is complete. Two lights need fixed and a large piece of trim above the altar fell that needs secured better. Phase 2 – the meeting room upstairs and 2 classrooms in the church basement – electrical work needs completed, one circuit has a dead short and the diagram is not matching the wiring.

New Business: Phase #3 of the project – new terrazzo flooring in the main body of the church and new pews are being installed. Progress is being made on the carport and installation of the fire alarm system. The new electric panel for the festival has been installed. It is estimated the floors in church and the entrance will be complete in 6 weeks. New church pews are to be installed by March 18th. The tunnel from church to school will be worked on over Easter.

Financial Situation of the building project: There have been a total of 5 change orders to the original plans. The 5th change order consists of painting a wall in the new overflow area, purchasing LED bulbs, additional emergency lights in the basement classrooms, additional exit lights and lowering the gas and water lines under the connector between church and school. 56% of the campaign monies have been collected as of the end of February. We need at least a 92% -93% return on the pledges to cover the total cost of the project.

Pastors Report – RCIA program, there will be 12 confirmations (5 are baptized adults) and 4 children baptisms, which total 16 new members. Father will be stressing Adoration during this Lent.

Next meeting will be held on March 28th, 2017 at 7:00 pm.
