## **Message from the Pastor**

In the last James Bond movie, *Spectre*, when asked by the girl why, given every other possible option, does a man choose the life of a paid assassin, Bond replies, "Well, it was that or the priesthood." A very interesting response. What if James Bond was Father James Bond? Too bad really; although I'm not sure if the Bond movie series would have been as exciting and successful if Bond would have been a priest. Actually, the life of a priest is very much more exciting and infinitely more successful, because a priest deals in the eternal salvation of souls, bringing life with spiritual weapons rather than death with a hand gun.

This is an intriguing line from a movie which reflects on our society today. Later in that scene he tells the girl that he hadn't stopped to think about it. People aren't stopping and taking time to discern well their life plan. They aren't seeking God's Will for their lives. People do recognize the goodness of a life given to God in service of others, like Bond who considered the priesthood. And they do try to do good in their lives, although sometimes by not so good means, and many times confused with selfish desires. Bond probably thought he was doing good by ridding the world of dangerous criminals. He was, though, caught up in a life which served his own needs and was entangled in sinful behavior. Later in that same scene, Bond declares that he wasn't sure he had a choice. Here is where he is totally mistaken. We all have a choice when it's God Will. God never forces anything on us. He wants us and gives us the grace to freely choose His Will for our lives. We only need the courage to choose it.

Everyone has the chance and the ability to serve others in a life given over to God. You don't need to be a priest or nun to do God's Will. You only have to make it your intention to do God's Will in whatever you are doing with your life, and to change anything that does not conform to being a follower of Christ. It's a matter of saying 'yes' to God and 'no' to yourself. Just do everything out of love for God and neighbor, whether it be a 12-hour shift at the factory or a long day at the office. Whether it be another load of laundry at home or an hour of prayer in the chapel at church. All for God; all for others.

God's Will is the path to happiness. God's Will is the path to heaven. Have courage, it is possible...with faith.

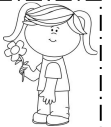
