Message from the Pastor

If abortion is not wrong, then what else is?! (a quote from Saint Mother Teresa). If you think about it, she has a point there. But today we live in a relativistic society. What may be wrong to you, is okay with me. It all depends. To each his own. Don't force your beliefs on me. etc.

That line of thinking only goes so far though. When we are talking about the life of an individual, even if it is only a potentially functioning human being, then we must take a closer look at this.

If we say that the "fetus" becomes a human person at a certain point in its development, we should ask "when?". Is it at 22 weeks...is at 28 weeks...is it when there is a heartbeat...is it at the moment of passage through the birth canal? When? Maybe it's when the umbilical cord is cut? Or, as even some intellectuals have said, when it becomes aware of itself as a person, making infanticide a possibility. And if we determine some point in time when we believe the baby's life should be protected, and any point before that it can be killed, then we are committing the sin of "ageism" – discrimination because of age. And inevitably we will fall into the trap of excusing the killing of an unborn child at a much later date, even at the point of partial-birth. This of course is an atrocity. But that's where Roe v. Wade and relativism has gotten us.

There can be no other remedy than to declare by law that there is life from the moment of conception and to protect that life throughout pregnancy. Science shows that there is a unique, individual human being from the moment the mother's egg is penetrated by the sperm cell of the father. There is a new, distinct DNA sequence present from that moment on. In other words, a human person, who should enjoy all the rights specified in the Constitution, exists from the moment of conception. It's not even a religious question per se. It's a human question. And to deny this is to be inhuman, with all the brutality that comes with it.

We need to change this unjust law of abortion on demand, which usually occurs because of the inconvenience of an unwanted pregnancy. We need to become heroic in defending life. Like the young mother in Detroit who deferred her cancer treatments in order to give birth to a healthy child, and died as a result. This is the kind of heroism we need today to stop the merciless killing of the next generation of American citizens.

Of course, it takes great faith to do this – faith and hope in the eternal life to come. But we can do it. I pray that in my life time, we do.
