Message from the Pastor

Last week we concentrated on tuning in on our vocation in life during Vocation Awareness Week; what God is calling us to be and to do in the years we have been given to live in this world. I hope everyone is praying the Prayer for Vocations at Mass with sincerity and devotion. I hope more and more people are spending time with our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament in the Sacred Heart Adoration Chapel, praying for vocations in our parishes. It is such a vital prayer for our church and for ourselves. Let's continue to ask God to give us the grace to know the path He wants us to follow.

It's in doing what God has planned for us that we are most happy and at peace. "In You, O Lord, I have found my peace" (Psalm 131). Once you get this, your life becomes a great adventure, full of meaning. Especially our young people – when they seek to do God's Will in their lives instead of the "usual" way of going to college, getting the car, finding a job, living with someone, maybe getting married and then living a 9 to 5 lifestyle without direction or purpose. Your life would be very different if you put God's Will as the axis of whatever you do.

This doesn't mean that everyone will become a priest or a nun. Most people are called to be married and have kids. The difference is in giving God the first shot at your life and sensing God's call to whatever vocation you take up. This will change the friends you choose, the college you attend and the way you date. When your heart is open to God's call, you live your life in a very different way.

I really think God is calling many young men of our parishes to become priests. I believe He is calling many young women to become consecrated religious. I know God is calling several men from our parishes to become permanent deacons. I also believe we are too distracted by the world and by our own selfishness and lack of true faith, that we are not hearing the call.

Give God a shot at your life! No matter how old; no matter what you've done already; let God call you. Open your heart! Ignite your faith! Take up the cross and follow Christ! Don't be afraid! Your true happiness and peace is found in God's Will. Now go out, find it, and do it!
