Message from the Pastor

“How about some cities declaring themselves a sanctuary city for the unborn and refusing to abide by the federal laws allowing abortion?”

This was singer Charlie Daniels (of “*The Devil Went Down to Georgia*” fame) reacting to cities declaring themselves sanctuary cities for illegal immigrants. Declaring a city, a sanctuary city for the unborn, would be a great thing to do... if we really were pro-life and our leaders had any moral fiber and courage.

But really, when are we going to stop the brutal, merciless killing of unborn children? When are people going to realize that this is one of the most terrible wrongdoings in our country’s history, right up there with the horror of slavery?

The leading abortion provider in our country, Planned Parenthood, says that it is a benefit to women’s health. Let’s look at the numbers. Planned parenthood does less than 2% of U.S. breast exams, less than 1% of U.S. pap tests, less than 2% of U.S. cancer screenings for women. No mammograms are done at Planned Parenthood clinics, and very little pre-natal care is provided. But, they do **30.6%** of abortions in our country. **Planned Parenthood kills over 320,000 unborn babies a year. That’s 877 abortions a day, or 1 abortion every 97 seconds!** And even worse, 13,000 viable, fully developed babies are aborted in late-term abortion procedures every year! Thirteen thousand perfectly formed little children are killed before they see the light of day!

When is our government going to finally stop aiding and abetting a business like Planned Parenthood in the murder of innocent citizens by cutting off federal funding - our tax payer dollars to the tune of \$500 million a year? Whether or not the money goes toward abortion, any organization which is primarily in the killing business, should not receive government support. There are better ways to use those tax dollars, such as funding pregnancy centers and community health clinics that don’t provide abortion services and do promote life.

Why is the government funding this murderous organization with my tax dollars? How can we continue to let this happen, day after day, year after year? We are killing our future before it even exits its mother’s womb. Where is the outrage? Where is the protest? Where are our legislators? Why are we allowing this horror to continue and pay for it?

On January 19th, I will be leading our youth to Washington DC to publicly protest the crime against humanity, against children and women, that abortion is. I urge parents to encourage their high school aged children to sign up and go with us. A trip like this can make the difference in the life of a young person and will help the Pro-Life cause greatly. For our future, get your kids to DC for the March for Life and let’s help put an end to this black mark on our country’s history.

Joyful News from Holy Rosary School

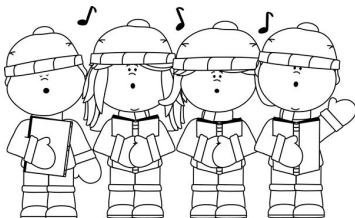
