Message from the Pastor

As we approach Lent, I think we must put things in the proper perspective, with our priorities in order. When we put God at the top, and in the center of our lives, it should change what we say, think and do. We are talking about God here. G-O-D. The Big Guy. The Boss. There is no one else like Him. He is not just a degree more important than anyone else, He is totally different and essentially vital to everyone ever born. God is completely Other, to use a philosophical concept. He is beyond us, not just bigger or stronger than us, but infinitely so.

God is our Creator. He made us and everything else in the universe. He is the beginning of everything. The cause of everything. The reason for everything. The goal of everything. He existed before everything, in timeless eternity, without beginning or end. He is all-powerful. He is all-knowing. He designed the universe and knows every bit of it perfectly down to the smallest subatomic particle. He is present at all times. He sees and takes note of every movement of every living thing that ever was or will be. God is outside of time and space. Time and space are in Him. He knows personally and intimately every creature He created. He knows and loves every human being He has made and will make. In a word... GOD IS AWESOME!

And so, it's obvious, God should get His due from us. All the created world obeys His plan. Nature acts as He intends according to laws which He set from the first moments of the Big Bang. Stars move in mathematical precision. Seasons follow one after another without fail. Sun and moon obey His laws, rising and setting day in and day out. But to us, He gave freedom to decide for ourselves; to act somewhat autonomously from Him (although we can never be totally autonomous from God; we depend on Him in so many ways). This freedom gives us the chance to give Him His due. He is due our praise. He is due our allegiance. He is due our attention. In a word, He is due our love. Not for Him, but for our good.

So, that is the most important reason why we should go to Mass every Sunday. Give God His due. It's just an hour a week. He deserves so much more from us, but asks us for this short time in church each week. He has no need of our praise. But we need to praise Him, recognizing Him as our Creator and Redeemer. That's why He put it into the Ten Commandments. Therefore, it's serious when you miss Sunday Mass for no good reason. You can miss if you were sick, or you are caring for a sick family member. Missing Mass on Sundays should be brought to the Sacrament of Confession, so that your soul is in the state of grace to receive Holy Communion.

For your spiritual health, please don't miss Sunday Mass. God has so much to give us each Sunday. When He sees any empty spot where you should be, it grieves Him not to be able to share His gift of grace with you that week. If you miss Mass regularly, please come to the Sacrament of Confession and get right with God. Then make a promise not to miss again. Give Almighty God His due.
