Message from the Pastor

Because the Catholic Church has always believed in the change of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ at every validly celebrated Eucharist, it follows that his presence in the Sacred Elements remains even after the Mass is concluded. He stays with us in the Eucharistic, sacramental, Presence. Of course, we don't keep the Precious Blood in a bottle in the Tabernacle due to the inherent nature of a liquid – we don't want to risk spilling it or it going bad. But the Sacred Hosts we do keep in what is called a ciborium (Latin literally for "food container") in the Tabernacle in a prominent place in our church and in our adoration chapel. Jesus remains present in the Consecrated Hosts to be with us, as well as for those who are homebound or sick to be able to receive Him.

And this is the Hidden Treasure of all Catholic churches throughout the world. Jesus makes his dwelling with us. He stays close to us. He is always there for us. We can come at any hour to be with Him; to adore Him; to speak to Him; to love Him. In the Blessed Sacrament we have Christ Himself, just as real as when he appeared to the Apostles in the Upper Room on the first Easter Sunday. It's an amazing thing, isn't it? To have our Lord and Savior right before us, physically present to us in the Tabernacle.

So, we call ourselves Christians, followers of this Jesus. Why don't we spend time with Him in the Blessed Sacrament? What's keeping us from visiting with Him on a regular basis, even dedicating an hour of our time each week to be in His Presence? It seems like a no-brainer. The Church has the power of the priesthood. We offer Mass every day. We believe in the Eucharistic Presence of Christ (don't we?). Then go to Him! Kneel before His majesty. Listen to Him in silence. Give Him your time every week.

If you have never gone into the Sacred Heart Adoration Chapel, give it a look see. Start out with a few minutes. Pop in once in a while. Find your spiritual resting time in adoration. You don't have to do a lot. Just be with our Lord. Maybe pick up the Bible or a good spiritual book off the book shelf in the chapel to help you pray. Bring all your worries, your troubles, your intentions to Him. He hears your voice. Then maybe you will want to sign up for a regular hour, or half-hour even, each week. Round the clock adoration does wonders for a parish. It will do wonders for your life as well.

Jesus is asking you, "Could you not watch one hour with me?" Now is the time to do it. *Fr. Barry*

Present: Father Barry Stechschulte, Dave Dwenger, Ellen Brown, Chris Knatz, Ed Poeppelman (maintenance), Kent Schlegel, Linda Lunz, Luanna Scott, Michael Mazzei. Not present: Nick Brackman, Dave Steinke, Vern Yahl.

The meeting was called to order and opened with a prayer led by Kent Schlegel.

Linda Lunz made a motion to accept the minutes of March 12, 2018, as emailed. Chris Knatz seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Old Business: Council members reviewed one carpeting bid submitted. Council would like to see bids from two other companies before making a decision. Work on updating the church bathroom is being done now. The estimated bid for new sacristy cupboards came in at \$4500. The transom over the front doors of the church is expected to be installed in the next week or two with an estimate of \$1500. The financial report found the parish in good standing.

CCD: (reported by Shannon Schwartz) March 7th we had our Stations of the Cross. Deacon Marty was in attendance. The kids seemed to be engaged with what Deacon had to say.....THANK YOU DEACON MARTY. March 21st we had scheduled Penance for the students. We will not be doing a full penance service. There will be prayers and then penance heard by Father Barry and a visiting priest. (This was cancelled due to weather). The last Children's Mass is scheduled for April 8th. Last class is May 2nd in which we have scheduled our May Crowning with Deacon Marty presiding. We were informed that Sally Eaton has chosen not to teach CCD next year. I will be asking Patti to be putting a blurb in the bulletin that we are looking for another teacher. At this time all other teachers will be returning. Sara and I will be meeting with Father and Nan in June to start the process for the 2018/2019 year.

Sally will be having a summer Bible School July 16-20. All St. Patrick CCD students are invited to attend the Totus Tuus program which will be held at Holy Rosary, July 21-27th.
