## **Message from the Pastor**

Come, Holy Spirit! Happy Pentecost!

So, how are you doing in your living out the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy that we talked about all during Lent? Have you volunteered in the community or in church yet? If God was looking at your life right now would He say, "Well done good and faithful servant, enter into your rest"? Would you be on his right or his left? Would you be one of the sheep or one of the goats? Have you been feeding the hungry and giving drink to the thirsty? Have you visited the sick and prayed for the living and the dead? Have you been forgiving and patient? Are you fulfilling to the best of your ability the Holy Spirit's call to be holy and to love your neighbor as yourself?

Maybe you heard those homilies during Lent and said to yourself, "I got to do something. I've just been doing my own thing for too long. I've been a bit selfish lately. I need to get out there and volunteer more." Have these thoughts been in your mind these days? Well, you'll see in the bulletin the Mercy Corner page with many volunteer opportunities listed, along with phone numbers and who to contact. If you've been lax in your self-giving, it's time to act.

I know it's hard to do this. We each have a million things to do between work, family, sports for our kids and grandkids, errands of all kinds, and no time to do them. But I also know that once you start volunteering, your life suddenly becomes more meaningful and you do find the time and you want to do more. It's amazing how when we give, we are able to give more, and our time is used so much more effectively. It's just a matter of doing it.

You want to know how you can do this? It's easy. And today is the best day to begin – Pentecost. You are able to give of yourself for others by living according to the Spirit and not according to the flesh. I should have said that it's simple, not easy. Not living according to the flesh, in other words, not seeking your own comfort and not selfishly serving your own needs, is not easy to do. Living your life by the Spirit, according to the Gospel and Church teachings, of unselfish love for God and for others, is also not easy. But once you give yourself over to the Holy Spirit, who is in you by baptism and confirmation, and you begin to seek to serve God and others before yourself, your life becomes so much more simple and worthwhile.

Living in the Spirit does not necessarily mean being slain in the Spirit or speaking in tongues. It means dedicated work on denying your lower self and living by higher things. It means praying every day. It means drawing near the source of grace – the Mass – each and every Sunday without fail; not because you have to go, but because you know it's the best place to be every week. It means doing the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy regularly. It means giving of yourself and then receiving the fullness of God's grace.

So, today let's begin (or continue) to live by the Spirit and watch as the Lord works wonders in our lives.
