I'd like to thank everyone who pitched in and volunteered for this year's festival. We couldn't do it without so many hardworking parishioners and friends. I look forward to a great effort next year and more of our young parish families to join in to make next year's festival even better.

For St. Patrick parishioners, the Parish Council and I have decided to take on the project of restoring and preserving the stained glass windows in church. We will be accepting donations right away. I will be getting you more information on the scope and cost of the project in the coming weeks. It is something that must be done in order to preserve St. Patrick's for years to come.

Also, we have decided to replace the boiler in church. The current boiler is very, very old (running on a prayer) and extremely inefficient. The new one will be a propane gas furnace and will save us quite a bit each year. We received 4 quotes and are going with Perry's Heating & Air Conditioning, with a cost of \$15,483. We will pay for this out of the capital campaign funds we collected last year. So your donations are going to good use.

Finally, you will notice some changes to the entrance at church. We are remodeling that space and it's going to be a great improvement and beautification.

So more great things are happening at both our parishes. Keep the prayers going and with God's help we will continue building a community of faith to the praise of God's glory.
