BUS TRIP TO THE SHRINE OF CHRIST'S PASSION

Where lives are changed one soul at a time!

Sunday, October 9th

Located at 10630 Wicker Ave. (US41) in St. John, Indiana, *The Shrine of Christ's Passion* is a multi-media interactive, half mile winding Prayer Trail that depicts the last days of Jesus Christ's life on earth. Forty life-size, bronze sculptures in a tranquil setting complete with beautiful music and amazingly sculptured gardens allow visitors to experience the story of the Crucifixion and Resurrection as never before! Chicago broadcaster, Bill Kurtis, narrates the audio recordings that you hear at listening stations along the path.

Construction on the interactive winding pathway began in 2001 and included 3,000 yards of concrete, approximately 80 semi loads of boulders, and more than 1,000 trees and bushes. Created by Texas artist Mickey Wills, 40 life-size bronze sculptures, weighing 300 to 700 pounds, vividly tell the story of the last days of Christ.

The Shrine is operated by a non-denominational, non-profit, 501(c)(3) private foundation. **There is no cost for this excursion.** The proceeds from the Gift Shoppe and donations help to maintain the grounds.

We will leave St. Marys at 6:15 am from K-Mart's parking lot and return by 7:30 pm. Bring your own sack lunch. We will stop for supper on the way home.
