**September 27, 2016**

The meeting was called to order and led in prayer by Bob Kantner.

**Members Present:** Bob Kantner, Fr. Barry, Jim Schloemer, Robbie Burke, Deacon Marty, Al Meinerding, Lil Heitkamp, Charlotte Duncan, Gene Wilker and Kelly Wilker. Peg Larkin & Elaine Paul were excused. Minutes from the August 23, 2017 meeting were approved.

**Altar Society:** Ambrose Dobrozsi was the guest speaker at the September meeting. The reception for those celebrating their 25, 50 and 60th wedding anniversaries was well attended. The Interfaith Breakfast will be held in the Meyer Room at Otterbein on October 7, at 9:30am. Last year 70-75 people attended the breakfast. This event takes the place of the October meeting. The society will pay for the refurbishment of the candlesticks for the new Adoration Chapel. Deb Stegall is in charge of the November 4 bake sale.

**Knights of Columbus:** The Knights purchased a Nativity scene which includes the Holy Family, an angel and the 3 shepherds. A donkey, a camel and cow have been donated by parishioners. They are still in need of the 3 kings and sheep. If anyone is interested in making a donation (\$250 for large figure, \$100-150 for small) contact Joe Kuebler at 419-733-4984. They would like to have a backdrop to resemble a stone cave-like shelter...any suggestions on how to achieve this are welcome.

**Youth Ministry/CONNECT:** The youth gathered around a fire with seminarian Ambrose Dobrozsi during one meeting. CCD met last week at Miller Funeral Home and this week will be meeting at Gethsemane Cemetery. These tie into their study of the Corporal Works of Mercy... burying the dead and consoling the sorrowful.

**Maintenance:** New aluminum spouting will be installed on the school to replace the old that has rusted through. No need to replace the fascia board which is in good shape. One of the sump pumps in the church boiler room has been replaced. The window air conditioner in the music room has died and will be updated with the new classrooms system.

**Finance Committee:** No report.

**Education Committee:** The Book of James Bible Study meets on Tuesdays at 7:00pm in the Modular with 12-15 participants. Consoling the Heart of Jesus meets Sundays at 6:30 pm in the cafeteria with 70-80 participating...some groups are conducting these studies at home. FORMED.org has 75 parishioners signed up. Joe Kuebler has graciously agreed to run a FORMED 101 class on Wednesday, September 28, from 7-8:00 pm in the modular. ConQuest Boys' Club has a record number of boys kicking off the year with 29 boys. Little Flower Girls' Club is underway with 15 K-3<sup>rd</sup> grade girls. CCD is well underway. On Sunday, October 2, from 9:00am – 5:00pm, Net Ministries will be leading a high school retreat. Our parish participated in the Heritage Celebration at the Shrine of the Holy Relics on Sunday. Youth from CCD and CONNECT! helped with set-up, ran a game, and served refreshments. A couple kids who were in Vacation Bible School sang in the opening ceremony. Dixie Russell and Dottie Lininger made a parish basket for the raffle whose proceeds benefit the Shrine.

The school is in the final year of OCSAA...annual accreditation. In Religion, they are working on Church History. Their academic goal is working on math critical thinking skills. This is a partial reason for updating our Math series. Ambrose Debrozsi will be leading the Rosary on October 7, for our school's feast day. This is the same day as Community T-shirt Day, so students will be dressed down while they celebrate Our Lady of the Rosary. Mass buddies are working out beautifully. Mrs. Baumer, the kindergarten teacher, had a baby boy. Two subs are helping out in our large Kindergarten class to help keep them on track through the holiday months. PTO is up and running. They will only have three fundraisers this year: Lucky 10, Night at the Races, and laundry detergent sales.

**Liturgy Board:** No report. They will meet in late October.

**Old Business:** Phase 1 concrete work is complete. The high roof and the chapel roof are done. The rafters are to be set next Tuesday on the overflow/classroom addition and that should be under roof by mid-October. The loading dock is complete and the dumpster will remain in the same place due to the need to keep sight lines open. A parishioner has volunteered to take over the weeding and trimming the landscape of our campus. Considering names for the adoration chapel...contact Fr. Barry with any suggestions

**New Business:** Questions were asked if there will be Stations of the Cross in the Chapel and also will there be red poinsettias for Christmas...this will be taken into consideration at the Liturgy meeting. Updates in the building include the addition of plumbing valves so turn-off does not have to involve the entire systems; computerized lighting which will result in opening up 48 breakers and allow more flexible lighting options; light bulbs in church will be switched to LED which hopefully eliminated "dark spots" in some areas. Terrazzo flooring will be installed at all entrances to the church; Mel's Decoration will install tile flooring in the worship area; new pews. The Bose speakers that were installed in the overflow are receiving great reviews. Sound in some parts of the main worship area could be better.
