Message from the Pastor

The March for Life was an incredible, historic event. Two busloads of high schoolers and chaperones from our area made the long, all night trek to Washington DC, to protest the 1973 Supreme Court decision "Roe v. Wade" which allowed a woman to end the life of her unborn child. We actually had pretty nice weather for a change and the crowds were amazing, full of energetic young people from across this pro-life country of ours. We heard our Vice President, Mike Pence, speak at the rally before the march – the first vice president to ever participate in the history of the March. The whole crowd was so buoyed with hopeful optimism at having an administration that supports the pro-life cause. Thanks be to God that the other candidate did not win the White House in November!

"Life is winning again in our country!" These were the words of our vice president to the thousands of marchers gathered in our nation's capital last Friday. And it is true. The number of abortions has decreased in the past few years. With 8 years of a pro-life president, followed by another 8 with a really pro-life president (our current vice president) we will see the end of the horror of abortion in the United States. We will look back on the 20th century and early 21st century and wonder how we could have allowed such barbaric practices like killing the unborn child in the womb of its mother, just like we now look at slavery of the African-American people a century ago or the slaughter of the Jewish people under Hitler.

To think that today, in modern America, we can actually debate whether or not it is okay to kill a child, astounds me. Science shows us clearly that what is growing and developing in the mother's womb is a unique human being. Just because he is attached and inside his mother, does not deny the fact that he is a human person. We must define as a person the individual from the moment of conception. If we don't, we will be constantly battling over when we can abort the child, putting the child's fundamental rights and worth at risk up on what point he is at in his young life.

In all this, life has to be more important than our own comfort and the desire for sexual freedom without consequence. We are living the results of the so-called sexual revolution of the 1960s and 70s. We have to have a counter-revolution, moving ahead to the true human and moral values that will make our country truly pro-life. I'll talk about those values in next week's message. God bless! *Fr.
