Message from the Pastor

I watched the movie "Becket" the other night. It was made in the 60's, but is a very good film, all about the life of St. Thomas Becket, who was a friend of the king and the chancellor of England way back when. To take control of the Church, the king appointed him as Archbishop of Canterbury, the most important position in the Church at the time. The movie follows Becket's life before he became archbishop; he held nothing as honorable, not even God. But once he became the leader of the Church in England, he put the honor of God before all else and defended the Church against the king. This set the king at odds with his old friend and in a drunken rant to his barons, he asked that Becket be "taken care of". They killed him while saying evening prayer in church.

There is a point in the film when the king sends his sheriff to arrest Becket on trumped up charges of misdeeds during his time of chancellor. Becket, fully vested and holding a great crucifix staff, warns the sheriff in a stern voice not to take the chance of losing his immortal soul. The sheriff backs off as Beckett remains, representing the authority and wisdom of the Church.

There was a time when people were concerned about the state of the soul. People would avoid things that endangered their souls. Mortal sin was the greatest calamity that could befall a person. Faithful Christians would suffer, even die, rather than commit a mortal sin and be forever damned to hell.

What is the soul that it is so important not to lose it? Your soul is you in the fullest sense. It is a spiritual reality, unique to each individual human being. It informs matter, making you what you are – an incarnate spirit. The soul is immortal, it can never die. But it is not meant to be alone. It is complete only with the body. After the body's life ends, the soul remains, but incomplete. That's why the resurrection of the body is essential in our Faith. At the end of it all, God will raise our mortal bodies and reunite our souls to our bodies; either for eternal happiness and fulfillment, or for everlasting pain and despair.

That's why it is so important to keep your soul united to God and in the state of grace. To be without grace (in other words, connected to God) is to be without real life. To die outside the state of grace is to destine yourself to an eternity without God; the most horrible thing that could happen to you.

What is mortal sin and what do you have to do to stay in the state of grace and be assured of eternal life, you ask? I'll talk more about that in next week's bulletin.

FRIENDLY FINANCES

Each year each parish is applied an assessment or tax by the Archdiocese. All revenue of the parish is assessed **except** for the following:

- The amount of each bequest that exceeds \$5,000
- One Faith, One Hope, One Love and CMA campaign payments to the parish
- Insurance settlements and proceeds from the sale of property
- Religious education fees and school tuition and fees
- Receipts from operating a school cafeteria
- Archdiocesan designated collections remitted to the Archdiocese
- Catholic Telegraph donations remitted to The Catholic Telegraph
- Receipts and interest for an educational endowment approved by the Archbishop
- Social and Fundraising expenses are subtracted from associated revenue before these revenues are assessed.
- Normal activities of school-related ancillary groups (PTO's, scouts, boosters, theater groups) are currently not being assessed.

Parishes are billed for the assessment in December. Half of the assessment is due in January, with the remainder due in June.

Our full assessment this year was:

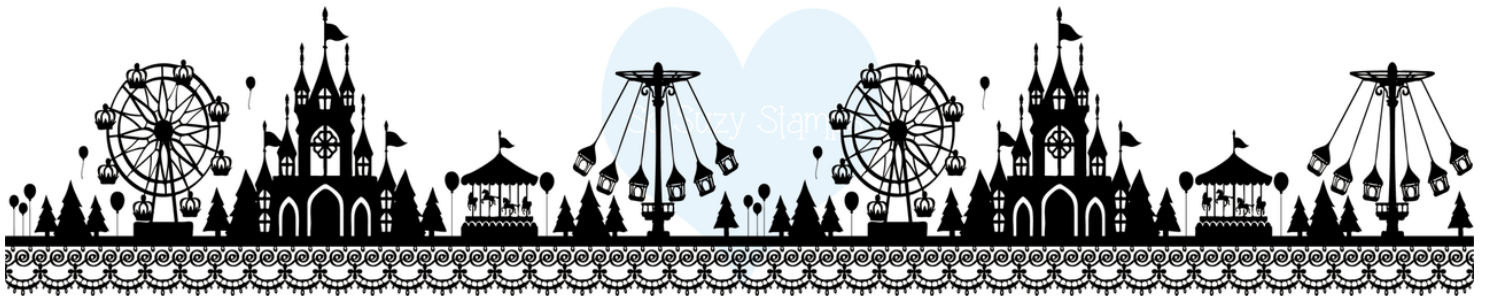
