## **Message from the Pastor**

"My sacrifice and yours..." These are words spoken by the priest at the end of the offertory rite at Mass. The priest asks that his sacrifice (the sacrifice of Christ, which he makes in the person of Christ as an ordained minister) and yours (you, the lay person in the pew) will be acceptable to God the Father. Are there two sacrifices at each Mass then? To find the answer, we have to look into what "sacrifice" means.

Every ancient people worshipped God through sacrifices. They would slaughter sheep, lambs, oxen, birds, to God, in some cases, like the Jewish people, every day. They also offered sacrifices of bread, grain, and wine (which is called a libation, pouring the wine out on the ground or altar). This wasn't done just to satisfy God (as if He needs meat or drink). It is done as a symbolic gesture of self-offering to God, in thanksgiving or in reparation for sins. The offering also says that God is more important and takes priority over our needs.

The key is self-offering. We have received everything from God; especially the gift of His mercy and salvation. We really owe our very selves to Him. Therefore, we make sacrifice, symbolically offering ourselves through the victim or offering.

So, when the priest asks that his sacrifice and yours be acceptable, he is distinguishing his ministerial priesthood from your priesthood as a baptized lay person. So, when you take part in the Mass you are offering your whole self to God through the sacrifice of Jesus (victim) in the hands of the priest (in Christ's person through his ordination). So, you are a priest at Mass and your offering is not just symbolic, it's real, because it's Jesus sacrifice which your offering is united to. What does this mean for you in the pew on Sunday? It means that you are living your vocation of baptismal priesthood. It means that your prayer at Mass, when offered with your whole self, your mind, your will, your body, all conformed to God's Will, is efficacious.

So, at the next Mass you attend, dial in to the fact of your baptismal priesthood and actively participate in the Sacrifice of the Mass. When the priest raises the Sacred Host, remember your intention and offer your whole self along with Christ. Then in your daily life, live according to that offering of your whole self, giving God the priority in your life and living according to who you are, a redeemed Christian; a priest, a prophet, and a king.
