Message from the Pastor

The school year is just around the corner and it's going to be a good one. With the renovation complete, we have a facility that will better serve our kids at school; especially the connecting hallway to the church and the church basement where the kids have their lunch. No more walking outside through the parking lot. This will greatly enhance our safety at school and keep the kids out of inclement weather.

We have 138 students in Kindergarten through 8th grade this year. That's the most since I've been pastor here. We have 23 students in our Preschool, with an additional 4 more Pre-K students coming in during the year when they reach the proper age. This is a wonderful thing for our parish. A thriving school is the best thing we could have and a real sign of the faith of our families and parishioners.

We also have our autism school now in our own hands. It's called ABLE (Academic and Behavioral Learning Environment) and has 5 students enrolled. They are using the rectory basement and will be able to provide a good setting for their students, especially with the daily interaction with Holy Rosary students. As it is now a part of our parish and not run by an outside company, it is our outreach to the families in our area who have an autistic child. It is a service we are proud to offer to our community.

For our adult faith formation this Fall, we have the Bible study group, which will meet on Tuesdays in the Upper Room and will be looking at the Letter to the Ephesians. Also, we have the fourth program of Fr. Michael Gaitley, "Wisdom and the Works of Mercy", on Sunday nights in the church basement. This follows last year's "33 Days to Merciful Love" program. You don't want to miss these great chances to learn and grow in your faith.

And finally, we signed up for FORMED.org, The Catholic Faith on Demand. It is a website rich in resources for the life of faith of you and your family. Take advantage of this; it will make a difference in your life. It will also make a big difference in our parish. Great things are happening here at Holy Rosary and St. Patrick's. Let's keep responding to the Holy Spirit's inspirations.
