## **Message from the Pastor**

What does it mean to adore God? The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that "Adoration is the acknowledgement of God as God, Creator and Savior, the Lord and Master of everything that exists, as infinite and merciful love." I think it should be the basic mindset and attitude of every human being, especially Christians and Catholics. To recognize God as He is, supreme and loving, almighty and compassionate. To adore God is to be in His Presence, knowing we depend on Him for our very breath and for our eternal salvation.

In the Catholic Church we have a special form of adoration – Eucharistic Adoration – or adoring our Lord Jesus Christ, True God and True Man, sacramentally present in the Sacred Host in our churches and chapels. At Mass, through the words and actions of the priest, Jesus becomes present in the Consecrated Bread Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. He remains present as long as the outward sign of bread is still there. That's why we don't just throw any extra hosts away after Mass. We place them in the Tabernacle, so that we can be with Jesus in a real way at any moment of the day or night.

Here at Holy Rosary we reserve a large consecrated host in the Sacred Heart Adoration Chapel, so that we can spend quality time, intimate moments, in prayer before our Savior at any time, and be able to see Him in the monstrance. This is called Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Seeing the sign of his presence in the Sacred Host gives us a more vivid experience of Him being there with us. We usually spend some time on our knees in adoration, just like in the Gospels when after a miracle the people knelt and did Jesus homage (another word for adoration). They recognized their God who was with them and acted appropriately.

Eucharistic Adoration is a vital part of the spiritual life of every Catholic, without exception. It is not just another devotion; it is essential. Every saint was especially devoted to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, because they knew the reality before them and were caught up in the truth of Christ's presence and their intimate union with Him. It is a truth of our Catholic Faith that no other religion has. It is the secret treasure of Catholicism – to have Jesus, the center of our faith – really and truly present with us. There is a physicality about this presence; its not just spiritual or emotional. It is objective, outside of us, and beyond our comprehension; but also, accessible. It is Heaven on earth. So, I encourage you to come often to the Adoration Chapel and spend a little time in our Lord's presence. You don't have to be skilled at prayer. You don't have to be eloquent or perfect. You just have to be you, and Christ will be there for you. *Fr. Danny*

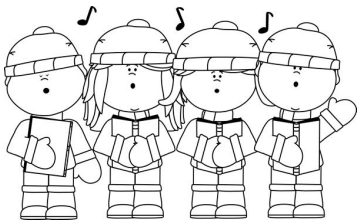
