## **Message from the Pastor**

Last weekend at the Mass for First Communion, I thought a lot about the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. What an amazing thing that Jesus would make it that he could be so close to us, physically, in the Blessed Sacrament. It makes his words at the end of the Gospel really come true, "I will be with you always, until the end of the age." And this is not just a memory or a kind of spiritual presence. It's a real presence, made possible by Christ himself through the sacramental and priestly power of the Church.

The neat thing and what we don't always realize fully or appreciate is that Jesus wants to be with us in this way, even coming into close contact with us by letting us receive him in Holy Communion. He gave us the True Bread from Heaven, which is eternal and not like food that perishes (ref. John 6:27). He wants us not just to be united to him, but to become like him. Through Holy Communion we can let ourselves be transformed into his likeness.

The Catholic Church has a unique understanding of the Real Presence and has the power of the Holy Spirit to bring it about. During Mass, the ordained minister says words over ordinary bread and wine, and they become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Other Christian denominations do not have the power to make this happen. Because they lost the Sacrament of Holy Orders (the priesthood), they no longer have the Real Presence. This is unfortunate. How many faithful Protestant believers want to be totally united to their personal Lord and Savior? If they only knew! Jesus is present in the Blessed Sacrament in every Catholic church in every corner of the world. Oh, how I wish they could make that act of faith in the Real Presence and see the Bread of Life right before their eyes and even better still, in their own bodies.

This belief of our Catholic Faith is very biblical. You can't read John, chapter 6 and not come away with a conviction that those words are true – "I am the Bread of Life" and "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." We do this by our reception of Holy Communion. It is a gift from God. It is for our spiritual nourishment. It is for our salvation. These are Jesus' words, not mine. It makes me wonder why Christian people of faith don't get this. Anyone who reads the New Testament and who studies what the early Church did and taught concerning the Eucharist would be hard pressed not to believe in the real presence. Of course, they would have to come into the Catholic Church to have it. And that might be a tough move. I pray they have the courage to do this and the blessings of belief in the real presence.

The Church has, from the very beginning, celebrated the Mass, or the Breaking of Bread, as it was called. I hope that people of today, Catholics and non-Catholics, will come to know and appreciate the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament and receive him into their bodies and into their hearts.
